INFECTIOUS DISEASES POSITION

The Section of Pediatric Infectious Diseases at the Medical College of Wisconsin is recruiting a qualified individual at the Assistant or Associate Professor level to join its current eight-member group to share in general Pediatric Infectious Diseases inpatient service activities, and to care for children and youth with HIV infection. Candidates should have completed an approved fellowship training program in Pediatric Infectious Diseases and be Board Certified or Eligible in both General Pediatrics and Pediatric Infectious Diseases. Interest in treating children and youth with HIV is required. The successful candidate does not need to have extensive HIV-related clinical experience: training in antiretroviral therapy of children and youth with HIV can be integrated into the first year of employment.

The Section is seeking an individual with broad clinical interests including infections in immunocompromised hosts, teaching and administration. Responsibilities would include sharing in general Pediatric Infectious Diseases inpatient service activities, care of children and youth with HIV seen in the Infectious Diseases Clinic at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin (CHW), and collaboration with the CHW Pediatric HIV Program.

Current areas of active investigation and clinical strengths within the section include CMV research, Antimicrobial Stewardship, HIV epidemiology and therapy, molecular virology, molecular techniques for rapid diagnosis of infectious agents, fungal immunology, and pathophysiology of CNS infections. Collaboration with a variety of clinicians and investigators within the Department of Pediatrics and basic science departments of the medical school is encouraged.

The Department of Pediatrics at the Medical College of Wisconsin has more than 300 full-time faculty. Its offices and laboratories are contiguous with the Medical College of Wisconsin, a large, free-standing private medical school, and the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, a 306-bed children's hospital.
