



Children's Minnesota, the 10th largest children's hospital in North America, is looking for a Pediatric Infectious Disease Physician to join their experienced Program. The Infectious Disease Program is currently composed of dedicated professionals including 7 physicians and 1 nurse practitioner, with a strong collaborative approach for clinical practice and decision making, and sub-sub-specialty interests.

The program cares for the majority of the children with acute and chronic infectious disorders in the greater area of the state of Minnesota and western Wisconsin, as well as intermittent referrals from eastern North Dakota and northern Iowa. The ID group practices at two hospital-based sites of Children's MN in Minneapolis and St Paul, which include large neonatal and pediatric ICUs, and a large and growing Cardiovascular ICU, with a heart transplant program.

We work collaboratively with talented hospitalist medicine and emergency medicine providers, and with the full complement of pediatric medical and surgical specialists. Our partners include a robust Immunology program, which includes 2 physicians and 1 nurse practitioner. Children's is home to the state's premier perinatal and pediatric HIV care program. We are also principle participants in the Antimicrobial Stewardship program, which includes a dedicated pediatric Infectious Disease PharmD and multidisciplinary working committee; as well as the robust Infection Prevention team. We are regular participants in Quality Improvement projects, including clinical guideline development.

The candidate should be ABP board certified or qualified in pediatric infectious disease, or have an international certificate equivalent. The candidate will be responsible for inpatient and outpatient infectious disease consultation, and ongoing care for patients with a broad variety of acute and chronic infectious conditions. The Children's Hematology and Oncology program is expanding to CAR-T cell and cellular transplants in the next couple of years, and particular expertise and interest in the infectious disease interface with these patients is desired. Children's serves a diverse patient population and is committed to continuous improvements in equity and diversity, including high level leadership and institutional support. The diverse population includes a number of large immigrant populations, which also provides a rich environment for practice involving global health and travel medicine.

Children's Hospitals and Clinics of Minnesota is a teaching hospital for medical students, nurse practitioners, residents, and fellows from the University of Minnesota and Mayo Clinic, and ID division members are actively involved in instruction and mentoring at all levels. Academic inquiry and research are highly valued, but are not prerequisites for members of the Department. We have a strong working relationship with our academic partners at the University of Minnesota Medical School, and with colleagues at the renowned Minnesota Department of Health.
