Job Title: Pediatric Infectious Disease

Brief description of the position: The Department of Pediatrics of Loyola University Chicago Stritch School of Medicine invites applications for positions within the division of Pediatric Infectious Disease. We are seeking two candidates, one at the rank of Assistant Professor and the second at the rank of Associate Professor to serve as the division director. Candidates must be Board Certified in Pediatric Infectious Disease and possess a state of Illinois physician license at the time of appointment. Members of the Department of Pediatrics provide care for children and adolescents at the Ronald McDonald Children's Hospital (RCMCH) of Loyola University Medical Center located in metropolitan Chicago. RCMCH is a 100 bed Children's hospital within a hospital. The Children's Hospital is recognized as a Regional Pediatric Critical Care Center, Pediatric Emergency Department, Level 3 Neonatal Intensive Care unit and Level 1 Trauma Center. The Pediatric Faculty provide teaching to our 30 Pediatric Residents, 16 Medicine-Pediatric Residents and students from the Stritch School of Medicine.

Research opportunities are abundant and encouraged at the translational, basic science and clinical level.
