Job Title: Assistant/Associate/Full Professor in ID Epidemiology

Brief description of the position: The Department of Public Health Sciences at the UConn School of Medicine seeks to fill a tenure-track position focused on infectious diseases. The successful candidate will have doctoral training in epidemiology and expertise in the analysis of population level data regarding pathogen transmission and mechanisms of infectious disease control. While the position does not require a disease-specific focus, candidates who combine methodological interests with experience in field epidemiology, data collection and collaboration with public health agencies on the study of emerging infections and population disease control strategies are encouraged to apply.

The Department of Public Health Sciences offers an MPH, PhD and certificates in addiction research, disabilities and disparities, and is a key contributor to the medical/dental curriculum. Our faculty has a strong culture of collaborative and integrative work, conducting research on a range of topics and maintaining extensive associations with international, national, state and local health agencies. Opportunities for collaborative work with our State's Department of Public Health and regional healthcare delivery systems are plentiful.
