Job Title: Pediatric Infectious Diseases Physician

Brief description of the position: The Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases in the Department of Pediatrics at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC) is recruiting a full-time board certified Pediatric Infectious Diseases physician with training and/or experience in pediatric HIV care. Qualified candidates must have an MD or MD/Ph.D degree, have completed at least three years of postdoctoral or clinical fellowship training. The position allows ample opportunity to partner with the adolescent medicine clinic, children's antibiotic stewardship program, VUMC clinical microbiology laboratory, and adult infectious diseases division. Candidates who are primarily clinical, as well as those with existing or planned funded research programs will be considered for this position.
