Brief description of the position: Nationwide Children's Hospital and the Department of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University seek an outstanding physician leader to direct a dynamic and growing Division of Infectious Diseases.

The successful candidate will lead a group of more than 19 pediatric infectious diseases faculty members and established programs in general ID, host defense, HIV patient-centered care, antimicrobial stewardship, and hospital epidemiology and infection control/prevention at Nationwide Children's Hospital. Our physicians provide direct care for more than 3,000 patients admitted to the Nationwide Children's Infectious Diseases Unit annually and clinical consultation for patients with complicated infectious diseases throughout the hospital, in close partnership with their primary care teams. American Board of Pediatrics certification in pediatric infectious diseases is required.

The successful candidate must be qualified for appointment as an Associate Professor or Professor on the clinical or tenure track and will be either a lab-based or clinical research physician-scientist who can oversee a robust research program. Expected collaborations are with the Director and Associate Directors of the Clinical Microbiology Laboratory and with 14 PhD faculty with established research programs in the Center for Microbial Pathogenesis and the Center for Vaccines and Immunity, both within the Abigail Wexner Research Institute (AWRI). The AWRI is ranked in the top 10 nationally for NIH funding to free-standing children's hospitals. Research programs are organized into 14 multidisciplinary Centers of Emphasis structured to encourage collaboration, facilitate team science, and foster creativity. Qualifications you are seeking: In addition to leading provision of the highest quality, evidence-based clinical care, the Division Chief must promote quality improvement programs germane to the field of infectious diseases, lead education initiatives for our medical student and outstanding residency training programs and advance the growing research capabilities of the Division. The ACGME-approved fellowship program matriculates two fellows annually from a nationally competitive applicant pool.

The Division Chief must visibly develop, embrace, and uphold principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion in alignment with the Nationwide Children's Hospital culture and belief that racism is a public health crisis, and all children deserve optimal health and best outcomes.
