Brief description of the position: The Division of Infectious Diseases at the Emory University/Children’s Healthcare of Atlanta is seeking a first-year pediatric infectious disease fellow to begin fellowship in July 2023. Our fellowship program is ACGME accredited and fully funded for the 3 years of fellowship. Fellows in our program will have vast training in the diagnosis and management of pediatric infectious diseases. Clinical training will occur at Children’s Healthcare of Atlanta hospitals which consist of three free-standing children’s hospitals, encompassing 638 licensed beds with about 27,000 hospital admissions and 100,000 outpatient visits a year. At our main hospital, Egleston, there are approximately 330 hospital beds, including a 45 bed pediatric ICU, 40 bed cardiac intensive care unit, 45 bed NICU and 10 bed bone marrow transplant unit. The hospital system offers bone marrow and solid organ transplants (kidney, heart and liver) and has a large oncology unit. From the outpatient perspective, we also have a robust outpatient infectious disease clinic that offers services four times a week (1,150 visit last year) and a large HIV clinic with about 700 HIV affected patients from newborns up to age 24.

Fellows on our program also experiences a two-year mentored research experience in either basic science, translational, clinical, global health, or epidemiological research. Opportunities to complete a Master program in Clinical Research are also available. In addition, our division has active collaborations with investigators in the Emory adult infectious disease division, The Rollins School of Public Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Carter Center and the Georgia Institute of Technology. Fellows may pursue international activities (collaborations in South Africa and Kenya) and may work with members of our Emory Vaccine Center and Vaccine & Treatment Evaluation Unit (VTEU). We additionally have growing opportunities for scholarship in hospital epidemiology, clinical microbiology, and antimicrobial stewardship and transplant medicine. Fellows from our program are eligible to apply for funded NIH-T32 training grant in vaccinology and/or HIV.
