Brief description of the position: The Vanderbilt University Medical Center Department of Pediatrics seeks candidates for the position of Chief, Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases. This is an onsite, full-time faculty position at the Associate or Full Professor level in either the tenure track or clinician-educator track. Track and rank will be commensurate with experience. Applicants must have an M.D or M.D./Ph.D. degree, or equivalent.

Qualifications you are seeking: Candidates must have an outstanding record of accomplishments as an academic leader, established investigator, and as a clinician and educator. It is anticipated that the successful candidate will bring with them a successful research program. The new Division Chief will have opportunities for major interactions with other relevant groups in the Department and throughout Vanderbilt University Medical Center and Vanderbilt University. The Division is one of the Nation's leading pediatric infectious disease programs with extensive federal research support and with international leaders in vaccine science and coronavirus biology, among other areas. The Division has brand-new wet bench research space coming online in early 2023. The Department of Pediatrics is a growing dynamic department with over 450 faculty and more than 200 trainees. Its primary home is within Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt, a 343-bed quaternary-care facility located in Nashville, Tennessee. The hospital has recently undergone a 2-floor expansion, and two further floors will be built-out over the next two years, including a new, state-of-the-art, inpatient and outpatient Clinical Research Unit. Vanderbilt University Medical Center is a leading academic medical center ranking 12th in 2021 for NIH funding.
