Brief description of the position: This one-year non-ACGME ID Host Defense fellowship position will provide pediatric ID fellows with a strong interest in pursuing a transplant/immunocompromised host (TID/ICH) career with additional focused training and specialized expertise in the diagnosis, management, and prevention of infections in immunocompromised children. The ID HDP fellow will be actively involved in clinical, research, educational, programmatic, and quality improvement endeavors, with experiences tailored to the individual's career goals.

Nationwide Children's Hospital is a 570-bed pediatric hospital, located in Columbus, Ohio. The Host Defense Program is comprised of a core eight-person team dedicated to improving ID-related outcomes for our patients, including hematopoietic cell transplant and solid organ (heart, lung, liver, kidney) transplant recipients, children with underlying malignancies, primary immunodeficiency diseases, and autoimmune/autoinflammatory diseases. Our team is committed to training the next generation of pediatric TID/ICH sub-specialists to expertly manage the unique needs of immunocompromised children.

Graduates of medical schools outside of the United States and Canada do require ECFMG certification. A J-1 training visa is also required.
